# **Scope Statement**

The Cataloguing Section is the centre of international developments in cataloguing theory, activities, and standards development within IFLA. The Section analyses the functions of cataloguing activities for all types of materials and media, including both bibliographic and authority information, for the benefit of all users. The Section proposes and develops cataloguing rules, guidelines, and standards for bibliographic information, taking into account the developing electronic and networked environment in order to promote universal access to and exchange of bibliographic and authority information. The Section also provides leadership in the development of various standards and guidelines related to bibliographic activities, such as corporate name headings, authority entries, and OPAC displays.

#### **Membership**

The section has 181 members.

The standing committee consists of 21 members and two corresponding members. (The size of the committee was expanded, with approval of the Professional Committee, from 20 to 21 due to a three-way tie in voting when two vacancies were declared in October 2005). Two members and a corresponding member are from Asia. Europe (with Russia) and North America are well covered but we are still eager to have participation from the remainder of Asia and from Africa, Central America, and South America.

#### **Meetings – August 2006, Seoul**

The Section's Standing Committee met in two sessions during the Seoul conference, attended by 37 and 31 persons respectively, observers included. Main topics of discussion included the following:

- reports of projects (see table below)
- reports of working groups and review groups (see table below)
- reports of two sessions of the International Meeting of Experts for an International Cataloguing Code (IME ICC): Cairo in December 2005; Seoul in August 2006
- update of the strategic plan for 2006-2007

Also noted was the resignation in March 2006 of John Byrum as Chair of the ISBD Review Group; he had held that position since 1986. The Standing Committee members and observers expressed their appreciation for his service by signing a certificate to be delivered to him.

The officers participated in two sessions of the Coordinating Board, Division IV (Bibliographic Control). Judy Kuhagen is the Secretary of the Coordinating Board.

# **Projects and Working Groups**

Title	Chair	Status
ISBD Review Group	Elena Escolano Rodríguez	The Future Directions Study Group met in Frankfurt in April (with support from ICABS) to continue work on a draft text of a consolidated ISBD. Taken into consideration were changes in revised drafts of ISBD(A), ISBD(CM), and ISBD(ER). The draft was posted for worldwide review in mid-July. The Group met in Paris in early December to review the comments and work on revisions to the text. The Study Group looks forward to a final consolidated ISBD being ready for publication in March or April 2007.  The Review Group reviewed the work of the Future Directions Study Group and made decisions about the content of the consolidated ISBD and the timing of the revisions. They submitted a motion to the Standing Committee that the consolidated ISBD will replace the individual ISBDs; that motion was approved by the Standing Committee.  The Material Designations Study Group did not meet in Seoul. GMDs incorporating new materials will be included in the first revision to the consolidated ISBD. Working Group on Anonymous Classics	Nadine Boddaert (liaison from Standing Committee to be named)	The final listing of African epics will be posted on IFLANET by the end of 2006. A section of Chinese classics will be the next draft for review.
Section liaison to Working Group on FRANAR (a division working group)	Glenn Patton	The Group reviewed several specific aspects of a revised/rearranged draft of the Functional Requirements document. This new draft contains most of the changes that resulted from worldwide review comments. There will be another worldwide review.  The Group will recommend that IFLA do nothing further in pursuing the idea of an ISADN (International Standard Authority Data Number) but, rather, focus its efforts on more promising projects such as the Virtual International Authority File.

FRBR Review Group	Pat Riva	The Working Group on FRBR/CRM Dialogue held three multi-day meetings during the year; a working draft of the object-oriented formulation of FRBR was distributed on the FRBR listserv in June.  The Working Group on the Expression Entity prepared an amendment addressing problems in defining the expression entity; the amendment was posted on IFLANET for worldwide review with comments due by Dec. 31.  The Review Group considered suggestions for revision of the model.  The new Working Group on Aggregates met for the first time in Seoul.  The Teaching and Training Working Group recommended its dissolution; the Review Group and the Standing Committee agreed. IME ICC planning committee	Barbara Tillett	To explore the ground for further harmonization of cataloguing rules internationally and a new Statement of International Cataloguing Principles. The report of the 3rd meeting for Arabic-speaking Middle East experts (Cairo, Dec. 2005) was published in August. The 4th meeting of Asian experts was held in Seoul just prior to the conference. Planning continues for the 5th and last meeting in South Africa in 2007.
Working Group for an International Cataloguing Code	Barbara Tillett	Work on an international cataloguing code (i.e., a code for rule makers) is postponed until all regional IME ICC meetings are completed.

The Group will meet in Copenhagen in February 2007.
