Scope Statement

The Cataloguing Section is the centre of international developments in cataloguing theory, activities, and standards development within IFLA. The Section analyses the functions of cataloguing activities for all types of materials and media, including both bibliographic and authority information, for the benefit of all users. The Section proposes and develops cataloguing rules, guidelines, and standards for bibliographic information, taking into account the developing electronic and networked environment in order to promote universal access to and exchange of bibliographic and authority information. The Section also provides leadership in the development of various standards and guidelines related to bibliographic activities, such as corporate name headings, authority entries, and OPAC displays.

Membership

The section has 161 members.

The standing committee consists of 20 members and five corresponding members, representing 16 countries. One member and two corresponding members are from Asia. Europe (with Russia) and North America are well covered but we are still eager to have participation from the remainder of Asia and from Africa, Central America, and South America.

Meetings – August 2007, Durban

The Section's Standing Committee met in two sessions during the Durban conference, attended by 37 and 29 persons respectively, observers included. Main topics of discussion included the following:

- Eeva Murtomaa reported on the Daisy Cataloguing Workshop in which she participated in June.2007 at Celia Library for the Visually Impaired, Helsinki. The Standing Committee agreed to work with the IFLA Section for the Blind on establishing guidelines for bibliographic control of such resources for the visually impaired

Judy Kuhagen and Ben Gu participated in the first session of the Coordinating Board, Division

IV (Bibliographic Control); Judy, Ben, and Anders Cato participated in the second session of the Coordinating Board. Judy Kuhagen was the Secretary of the Coordinating Board for 2005-2007; Anders Cato is the Secretary of the Coordinating Board for 2007-2009.

ISBD Review Group	Elena Escolano Rodríguez	The preliminary consolidated edition of the International Standard Bibliographic Description was published in August 2007 as an updating loose-leaf; the publication was prepared by the Study Group on Future Directions of the ISBDs. The first update to the consolidated edition will be released in 2009. A separate compilation of full examples in at least the seven official IFLA languages, being prepared by the Examples Supplement Study Group, will be posted on IFLA's Web site in 2009. The Material Designation Study Group will be preparing recommendations for a mandatory content and carrier component to replace the GMD (general material designation). Working Group on Multilingual Dictionary of Cataloguing Terms and Concepts		Patrice Landry, Chair of the Classification and Indexing Section, reported at the first SC meeting in Durban that the SC of his section preferred to delay work on this project until other related tasks were completed.

Working Group on Anonymous Classics	Nadine Boddaert (liaison from Standing Committee to be named)	Neither task (posting of African epics as a finished section; release of Chinese classics for review) planned for 2007 was accomplished. N. Boddaert has been consulted about ongoing interest in this project.
Section liaison to Working Group on FRANAR (a division working group)	Glenn Patton	Glenn Patton reported that the working group had resolved the eight major issues from the 2007 worldwide review. After editorial work has been completed, the final draft will be submitted for division approval. It is anticipated that work will be completed by May 2008.
FRBR Review Group	Pat Riva	The review group will develop a namespace for FRBR entities/elements in RDF; the work will be done by consultants to the review group. The FRBR Working Group on the Expression Entity forwarded its recommendations on proposed changes to the Expression Entity text (FRBR Chapter 3) to the FRBR Review Group for its approval and comments; the Cataloguing Section Standing Committee approved the amendment (the first amendment to the FRBR model). The FRBR Working Group on Aggregates prepared a discussion paper on the issues related to applying the FRBR model to aggregates. The Working Group on FRBR/CRM Dialogue completed a draft of an FRBR object-oriented model for museums. IME ICC planning committee	Barbara Tillett	To explore the ground for further harmonization of cataloguing rules internationally and a new Statement of International Cataloguing Principles. The report of the 4th meeting of Asian experts (Seoul, 2006) was published in August 2007 in four languages (Chinese, English, Japanese, and Korean). The 5th and last meeting was held in Pretoria, South Africa in August 2007. Voting by all participants on the latest revision of the draft statement of principles began before the end of the year; the draft will be submitted for worldwide review in 2008.
Working Group for an International Cataloguing Code	Barbara Tillett	Work on an international cataloguing code (i.e., a code for rule makers) is postponed until after the worldwide review of the draft statement of principles in 2008.

Working Group on Metadata Guidelines for Digital Objects	Erik Thorlund Jepsen	The working group met in Copenhagen in February. Recommended guidelines will be distributed for review in 2008.
IFLA World Digital Library Working Group on Digital Library Guidelines		Jaesun Lee and Marcia Zeng, along with nine other members from nine countries, have been appointed to this working group. Claudia Lux, now the current IFLA president, convened the group and chaired the first meeting held at the Library of Congress in May 2007. The members of the group organized their work and established subgroups to work in the areas of content selection, metadata (Marcia Zeng and Jaesun Lee), technology, service, and organization. The group will produce a set of recommendations and guidelines by mid- 2008.

Conference programmes

The Section reported on its activities in a handout distributed at the Open Forum of the Division of Bibliographic Control and a short presentation highlighting the two main activities of the year: publication of the consolidated edition of the ISBD and the fifth International Meeting of Experts for an International Cataloguing Code in Pretoria just prior to IFLA.

The section's open programme theme was "Cataloguing partnerships: principles, standards, and projects." The five presentations are listed below.
