KM and WSIS



The objective of the summit was to develop and foster a clear statement of political will and take concrete steps to establish the foundations for an Information Society for all, reflecting all the different interests at stake.

IFLA has been heavily involved in the preparations for the World Summit on the Information Society, the first phase of which was held in Geneva, December 2003 and the second phase in Tunis, 16-18 November 2005.

In 2006, the IFLA WSIS Contact group had meetings with UNESCO as leading agency for the implementation of WSIS Action Lines. The Information for All Programme (IFAP) takes a particular interest in the following Action Lines:

- Access to information and knowledge
- ICT Applications
- Cultural diversity and identity
- Linguistic diversity and local content
- Ethical dimensions of the Information Society

Knowledge Management experts should play a key role in the implementation of the WSIS Action Lines, by taking part in national and regional plans for the development of information societies. The issue of cultural diversity and identity is of special interest for IFLA KM Section: with its strong global aspect, it brings together different ways of organizing knowledge.

Participation in WSIS implementation activities will raise awareness for the impact of professional Knowledge Management and underline the core role of libraries in the development of democratic, inclusive knowledge societies.

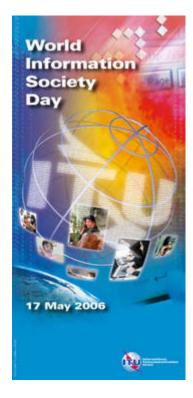
