The proposed theme and the presence of specialists attracted the interest of specialists from Mexico and Latin America. The event was **attended by 150 people**. Thanks to the support of IFLA, **44 students** and professors received scholarships.

The theme attracted the interest of media professionals, researchers, teachers and students of librarianship, information science, archival science and documentation.

A SURVEY OF BORN DIGITAL NEWSPAPER COLLECTION PRACTICES IN THE UNITED STATES

Donnie Summerlin, Digital Library of Georgia

With the widespread adoption of publishing software and production of digital print masters by newspaper organizations, the prospect of collecting born digital newspaper files has become a feasible alternative to microfilming for libraries and archives in recent years.

The DLG began an initiative to investigate born digital newspaper file collection and preservation activity in the United States, with the purpose of better understanding the practices of others before committing to a transition away from microfilming. This investigation included a survey of institutions that collect born digital newspapers on a statewide basis. The results of the survey provide a portrait of born digital newspaper collection practices in the United States, including the manner in which newspaper files are collected, the labor devoted to the process, the types of files collected, embargo periods, and the number and percentage of newspaper titles collected by these state organizations. The findings of the born digital newspapers survey are supplemented by information gleaned from follow-up correspondence with the survey participants. The post-survey communications aided in clarifying the results of the survey and revealed the challenges associated with workflow procedures, publisher participation, and copyright permissions. This presentation explored the results of the survey with the hope that it will assist other organizations interested in establishing or expanding their own born digital newspaper collection efforts.

DOWN THE RABBIT HOLE: COLLECTING #METOO THROUGH SOCIAL MEDIA AND NEWS ARTICLES

In July 2018, the Schlesinger Library on the History of Women in America launched a project to comprehensively document social media, news articles, press releases, judicial decisions, and other materials related to the #metoo hashtag that went viral on Twitter during the last quarter of 2017. With the guidance of a steering committee composed of Harvard University faculty and librarians, a series of policies and procedures have been developed to strategize the best ways to approach the ethics of providing access to electronic news and social media. These policies cover appropriate platforms to distribute and provide access to the materials for researchers, while being mindful of the terms of use and copyrights surrounded the millions of items included across the dataset. This presentation engaged the audience in the journey down the #metoo archival rabbit hole and shared lessons learned and best practices for documenting social movements on social media.






LA CURACIÓN DE DATOS DE LA HEMEROTECA NACIONAL DIGITAL DE MÉXICO, UN PROYECTO

La Hemeroteca Nacional de México, con base en su colección de microfilms, creó en el 2002 la Hemeroteca Nacional Digital de México, la cual está integrada por títulos de gran relevancia histórica y cultural pertenecientes a sus colecciones. Este repositorio se encuentra relacionado con el OPAC de la institución denominado Nautilo y existe la relación entre los registros de las publicaciones en formato papel y su liga al formato digital; los títulos corresponden a la colección de microfilmes de los periódicos y revistas de los Siglos XVIII y XIX, los cuales fueron digitalizados y después les fue aplicado OCR para un reconocimiento de caracteres y estar en posibilidad de hacer búsquedas por palabra en el texto completos de la publicación.

NEW NEWSPAPERS: CHANGES IN ACQUISITIONS AND ACCESS AT THE U.S. LIBRARY OF CONGRESS

Robin Butterhof, Library of Congress

In early 2018, U.S. copyright regulations were amended to require online registration and digital deposits for group registration of newspapers, the primary method of registering newspapers for copyright protection in the United States. The first digital copyright deposits under these regulations arrived in March 2018. During the summer of 2019, a second digital delivery method was created for newspaper publishers that did not choose to register their titles, but whose publications were selected by the Library for its collections under legal deposit regulations.

To provide access to these copyright-restricted collections, an onsite access system for this content as well as other restricted non-newspaper content was built in 2019 and is now available to researchers at the Library. In addition to legal deposit for print newspapers, the Library of Congress has used web archiving as a technique to capture online-only news sites since 2014. This presentation explored the challenges and techniques employed in this preservation process.

NEW CHALLENGES FOR NEWS IN NEW ZEALAND

Amy Joseph, National Library of New Zealand

This presentation identified the gaps that have the potential to emerge in New Zealand news collection as news media increasingly migrates online. It demonstrated some of the ways in which the National Library of New Zealand are addressing these gaps in partnership with publishers and other collecting institutions, and it also highlighted some areas where we still have more questions than answers, and want to collaborate with others asking similar questions. Finally, it considered the future of print news media collecting in an increasingly digital landscape.



"HACKING THE NEWS" WORKSHOPS: LESSONS LEARNED

Sally Chambers y Olga Holownia, Ghent Centre for Digital Humanities, British Library

This presentation explored lessons learned from two workshops on text and data-mining of digitised newspapers and born-digital news (2018 DHN Conference and 2019 RESAW Conference). Both workshops aimed to provide an introduction to a range of topics to consider when undertaking digital analysis of newspaper corpora and analysing web archives for humanities research. Rather than focusing solely on the research use of web archives, the participants were encouraged to explore whether and how web archives can be combined with other digital resources in order to create a project around a specific topic such as news. Key conclusions of these workshops included: a) that web archives still pose a significant methodological and technical challenge even for experienced DH researchers and b) that providing a pre-processed dataset, with the necessary rights cleared, is essential. What we propose is that in addition to understanding the complexity of WARCs, it is perhaps the process of experimentation itself (in the spirit of the international GLAM Labs initiative) that offers the richest learning opportunities.

YEAR 4 OF THE EAST VIEW GLOBAL PRESS ARCHIVE®: LESSONS LEARNED FROM A MASSIVE NEWSPAPER DIGITIZATION PROGRAM

In 2016, East View Information Services initiated a partnership with Stanford University Libraries and the Hoover Institution Library and Archives to digitize and make available 25 million pages of newspapers from around the world, most in Chinese, Japanese, Arabic and Cyrillic languages. This partnership served as the catalyst for East View to greatly expand its newspaper digitization program now known as the Global Press Archive. In 2019, East View extended the partnership to include the Center for Research Libraries to make widely available 4.5MM pp. of newspapers as a combination of Open Access and consortia-wide collections. This presentation highlighted both partnerships as successful models for supporting the digitization and distribution of massive newspaper collections, and highlight key lessons learned from the program. Topics will include: logistical challenges, the development of cloud-based workflows, copyright, and publishers, the challenges of non-Roman languages including Arabic, Chinese and Japanese scripts, and broad accessibility through consortia and Open Access collections



DIGITIZE LOCALLY AND SHARE GLOBALLY: USING GRANT FUNDING TO PROVIDE AND PROMOTE ACCESS TO LOCAL NEWSPAPERS IN WYOMING

Bryan Ricupero, Amanda Lehman y Samatha Peter, University of Wyoming

The University of Wyoming Libraries applied for and was awarded a National Endowment for the Humanities National Digital Newspaper Project (NDNP) Grant. The initial round of funding provides for the careful selection of 100,000 pages of historical newspaper content from the state of Wyoming. In Wyoming's case, this may include improving existing digital newspaper collections. This presentation explores unique challenges and advantages in the beginning of this 2-year process.
