CB Meeting August 8

The new professional structure of IFLA will be after the Milan congress. RISS will join a new Division III: Library Services . Bodil will send out copy of the statute changes to SC. There have been complaints about Congrex's handling of the registration this year. Visa problems have excluded even governing board members. 3200 attendees have pre-registered for the conference.

Each Section will select a paper to be suggested for publication in IFLA Journal. CB will choose 2 of them for the final suggestion.

Sections are invited to attend President Elect's brainstorming session. Her theme will be "Libraries Driving Access to Knowledge".

Finances: RISS is one of few sections who have spent any of their administrative funds. The Governing Board has suggested that money left should be transferred to IFLA Foundation. Will be discussed at next CB meeting.

Susan Fingerma volunteered to attend President Elect's brainstorming session.

Treasurer's Report

RISS has now 63 members (55 last year)

RISS Treasurer Martin Kesselman gave a brief survey. Administrative expenses (print etc.) will be covered. We have only spent around 50 Euros of our 325 Euros.

Also it is possible to use the Administrative fund for teleconferencing.

5. **Matters regarding Quebec Conference: Open Session and other Issues**

Open Session

4 papers selected. All on the programme web site. Thanks to Concha they are also translated into Spanish.

Will be a very fine programme.

Agenda for the session and "who does what" was organized and agreed.

GENLOC Satellite conference - Ottawa

The conference was a success. The financial problems were solved . The presentations was very inspiring – and the conference made a small profit with 41 attendees: the conference also served as a work shop. The location was perfect and the study tour well organized. Work in the organizing committee has functioned very well. The outcome of the conference will be up on the conference web site.

Rethinking Access to Information – Boston

Also successful, inspiring and well organized.

132 participants – mostly for USA but also from Eastern Europe, Egypt, Nepal and The Ivory Coast. Several participants did not go on to the Quebec conference.

The presentations were a mixture of reports on rethinking projects and “blue sky-thinking”. The venue was the Abbey Room at Boston Public Library with the story of the Holy Grail on the wall paintings – also an inspiration for one of the presentations! 11. SC communications during the year (incl. midterm meeting)

Teleconferencing was discussed. Most effective in a small community. RISS will instead work on a social network on the new IFLA website which will be up by January 2009. (RISS will be one of the test groups)

Midterm meetings will be held biennially - when the strategic plan is on the agenda.

Next midterm meeting will be in 2010 and will be combined with a library event.
