Our early childhood program, for babies 6- 24 months is presented over four weeks in two, thirty minute sessions at all of our major branch libraries.

Each session includes:

Singing & bouncing - songs and rhymes expose babies to the rhythm of language and encourages the development of pre- literacy skills.

Quiet reading time, sharing books with babies assisted by staff
