


- Around 1950 the Union of the Blind in Iceland started to produce a few audio books – the demand grew constantly.
- In 1982 the Library for the Blind was founded in Iceland
- Services for those who cannot read printed matter for any reason from the beginning
- In the beginning most patrons were blind or partially sighted
 - The number of elderly patrons grew fast







To put it short: we turned a cassette books library focused on the elderly into a digital library focused on all age groups.






We simultaneously worked on ...

- Focusing on different age groups young people dealing with dyslexia







Road trip around Iceland 33 schools visited














Ole Lund Kirkegaard 1940 -1979 And we took the example of Rubber Tarzan, a persona created by Ole Lund Kirkegaard.




