
I. Parliamentary Outreach

- A niche for re-use of research information and outputs in facilitating Parliament and legislators to communicate with the general public has emerged under the <u>parliamentary outreach</u> in Kenya.
- Among the activities that have since evolved upon rolling out outreach three years ago include:-
 - ✓ Participation and exhibition at trade fairs,
 - ✓ Parliament week/Open day,
 - ✓ Public lectures at universities, and
 - ✓ County visits.



Framework for Effective Interface


☐ The broad spectrum underpinning <u>parliament-legislator-general public</u> communication nexus





2. Forging Linkages and Partnerships

- Aim: enhance deployment of research information and outputs to strengthen evidence informed decision-making.
- ☐ Implemented over the last four years, this approach has strengthened the research-to-policy nexus.
- ☐ Is a critical communication approach for parliaments and legislators with stakeholders in research and public policy.
- ☐ Two outcomes so far:-
 - (i) Establishment of a "Parliamentary Caucus on Evidence informed Decision Making (PC-EIDM)" and
 - (ii) Development of "<u>Guidelines for Evidence Use in Policy Analysis and Decision-Making".</u>
